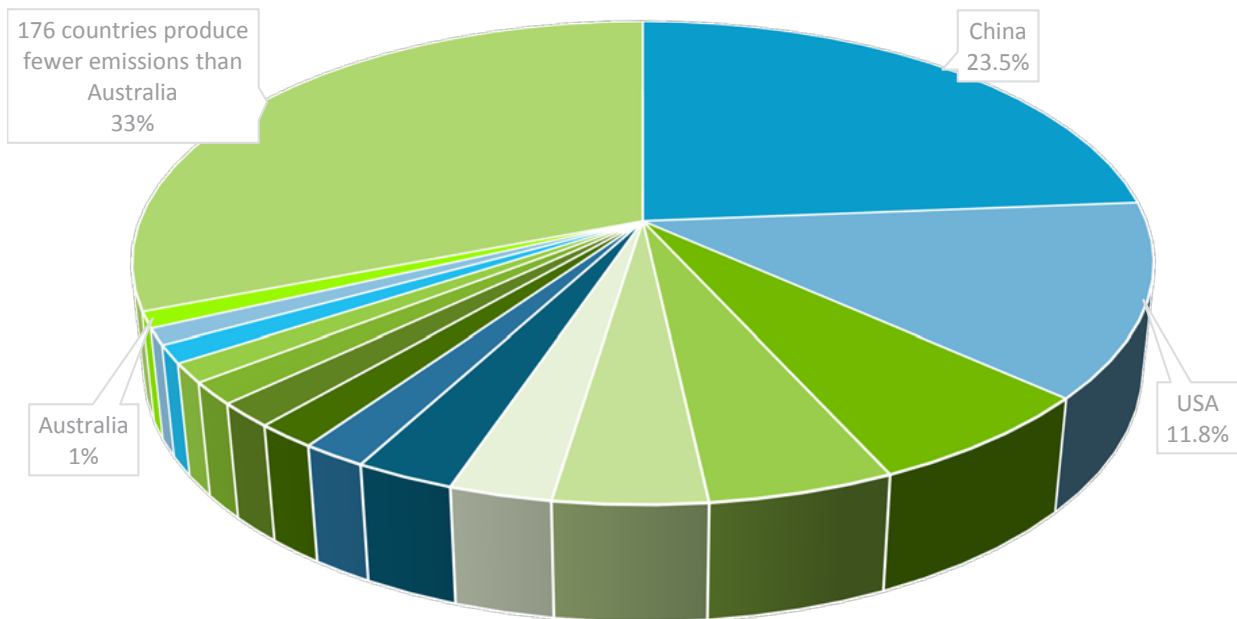
Global emissions

Australia is the world's 14th largest emitter producing 1% of global emissions.

The world's two biggest emitting countries, China and the United States, together produce 35% of global emissions.

176 countries produce less emissions than Australia but collectively account for 33% of global emissions. This group of countries account for more emissions than any individual country, highlighting the importance of countries with relatively small emissions taking action in support of the Paris Agreement.

Around 100 companies from over 24 countries account for 71 per cent of all industrial greenhouse gas emissions produced. The products of these companies are used globally.
